

<u>Math & Science</u>: In math, students will generate data by measuring length to the nearest quarter-inch and organize the data in a line plot. In science, students will identify Earth's resources, explain human impact, and identify solutions for conservation.

<u>ELA & Social Studies</u>: In ELA students will compare and contrast texts, identify idioms, identify suffixes, and write a text dependent analysis. In SS, students will identify the causes the American Revolution.
