

<u>Math & Science</u>: In math, students will determine the perimeter of polygons, including finding the perimeter given the side lengths and finding an unknown side length. In science, student will analyze characteristics of environments and describe how the environment supports different living things.

<u>ELA & Social Studies</u>: In ELA students will be able to write a text dependent analysis with an introduction, body, and conclusion, use context clues, identify multiple meaning words, and look at Greek words to determine the meaning of a word. In Social Studies students will be able to identify the events and battles of the Revolutionary War.

In <u>Read 180</u>, students will participate in independent reading, software, and small group. In small group, we will target specific reading/writing skills based on the needs of the group.
