

<u>Math & Science</u>: In math, students will partition shapes, identify types of angles, and recognize 3D shapes.

In science, students will identify natural resources and give examples of methods for conserving.

<u>ELA & Social Studies</u>: Students will identify text structures, write an opinion piece of writing, identify plurals that end in y, identify the fact opinion, and identify simple/complex sentences. In SS, students will be able to identify the interactions of colonists between the Native Americans and Africans.

In <u>Read 180</u>, students will participate in independent reading, software, and small group. In small group, we will target specific reading/writing skills based on the needs of the group.
