

<u>Math & Science</u>: In math, students will identify rules and patterns in the 100s multiplication table. In science, students will describe features of the Earth's surface.

<u>ELA & Social Studies</u>: Students will identify different text structures such as sequence of event, write an opinion piece of writing, identify adverbs, write analogies, and identify proper nouns. In SS, students will be able to identify how European settlers contributed to the development of colonial South Carolina.
