

<u>Math & Science</u>: In Math students can understand equivalent fractions and compare fractions using different strategies. In science, students can explain how magnets attract and repel and how electricity and magnetism can be transformed.

<u>ELA & Social Studies</u>: In ELA students will be able to determine the theme of a story by recalling details that support the theme. They will also create a narrative piece of writing by understanding narrative elements and review spelling patterns. In Social Studies, students will compare the culture, governance, and physical environment of the Cherokee, Catawba, and Yemassee Native Americans.

In <u>Read 180</u>, students will participate in independent reading, software, and small group. In small group, we will target specific reading/writing skills based on the needs of the group.
