

Math \& Science: In Math students can represent fractions and compare different fractions using >, <, and $=$. In science students can explain how electricity is transferred in a circuit.

ELA \& Social Studies: In ELA students will be able to determine the theme of a story by recalling detans that support the theme. They will also create a narrative piece of writing by understanding narrative elements and write in a complete sentence with correct punctuation and capitalization. In Social Studies, students will compare the culture, governance, and physical environment of the Cherokee, Catawba, and Yemassee Native Americans.

In Read 180, students will participate in independent reading, software, and small group. In small group, we will target specific reading/writing skills based on the needs of the group.
