

<u>Math & Science</u>: In Math students can represent fractions and compare different fractions using >, <, and =. In science students can explain how electricity is transferred in a circuit.

<u>ELA & Social Studies</u>: In ELA students will be able to determine the theme of a story by recalling details that support the theme. They will also create a narrative piece of writing by understanding narrative elements and write in a complete sentence with correct punctuation and capitalization. In Social Studies, students will compare the culture, governance, and physical environment of the Cherokee, Catawba, and Yemassee Native Americans.

In <u>Read 180</u>, students will participate in independent reading, software, and small group. In small group, we will target specific reading/writing skills based on the needs of the group.
